

FDP on innovation & entrepreneurship begins at KU's Zakura Campus

To promote an innovation-driven academic environment, the Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (CIIE), Institute of Technology (IoT), Zakura Campus, University of Kashmir (KU) inaugurated a five-day Faculty Development Program (FDP) on 'Innovation and Entrepreneurship.'
